This past month, Cathy and I have been enjoying the beautiful sunflowers that have taken over the flowerbed behind the parsonage. We did not plant them - they are simply a result of the many bird feeders that grace the garden to feed the birds during the winter season, when food is scarce, and also during the spring, as they labor to build nests and feed their young. Recently, a visitor called them "volunteer flowers" - not planted

on purpose, but a natural byproduct of the seeds that have been scattered or have fallen to the ground as the birds come to eat.

Those beautiful sunflowers are filled with hundreds of seeds - all arranged in a perfect circular pattern. Some will feed the birds during the summer and fall, and others will fall to the ground, waiting to give rise next summer to a whole new crop of yellow-headed, sun-worshipping flowers. I never cease to be amazed at the intricate ways that God has designed to provide for His creation.

This week, as I was reading again the story of Moses, I was reminded of something that I heard many years ago, concerning God's promise to lead His people into a land "flowing with milk and honey", that they might "live long, and prosper", enjoying a harvest from the land that they had neither planted nor worked for. In Moses' day, milk was considered a staple of existence - necessary for nourishment and growth. Honey, on the other hand, was rare treat - a luxuriously sweet, golden nectar that promoted healing and wholeness.

I share that with you as a reminder that God is in the business of providing not only what we need to grow and become strong in our faith, but also delights in showering us from time to time with luxurious and unexpected gifts that celebrate His goodness and His mercy.

I pray that God will give you eyes to see anew the beautiful things that He has planted all around you, as He works to meet your needs, and to shower you with good gifts - just because He Loves You So!


