



#### MISSION UPDATE FOR SEPTEMBER



Our Monthly Home Mission Project for October is Mission Central . They will receive a \$350 donation .

Mission Central is the mission warehouse affiliate of the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church. Their goal is made up of 3 key components: Disaster Response, Mission Outreach and Mission Education. Mission Central has been there to assist people around the world, and as a member of the UMCOR Relief Supply Network they have been able to provide aid for people affected by every major weather event since there beginning in 2002. Locally they have teamed with ministry partners such as Bethesda Mission, New Digs, Computer Ministry and Project C.U.R.E., providing relief and assistance right here in Central Pennsylvania and the surrounding regions. Mission Central truly is a place that connects God's resources with human need.
