A Word About Our Future....

January has come, and the sanctuary looks and feels very different. The walls are bare; the altar area stripped of its trees and lights and poinsettias. The banners adorning the walls - proclaiming the coming of our King and Lord - are rolled up and packed away for another year. The sanctuary remains empty and dark - void of the worshippers who once gathered here. The classrooms lie silent - longing for the sounds of children, and the scampering of feet. Even the coffeepot is unplugged - its regular use no longer needed. The offices are empty, the calendar bare. What has become of the place that we have for so long come - desiring to be gathered; to connect with each other; to be challenged; to give back to our communities through service; to grow our faith in? What has happened to the church - to the place where God is, or was, or at least - seemed to be, for so many years? Never (at least in the foreseeable memory of the church), has there been a time such as this.

So, what will become of our beloved church? It is a question that has crossed my heart so many times this past year. Can a fish survive out of water? If so, for how long? And at what cost? Will we survive this season of fallow in our lives, and in the life of our church?

I can only imagine the shock of the people when Moses came down from Mt Sinai and shared with them God's decrees for caring for the land that they were about to take possession of. Recorded in the Book of Leviticus (also known as the Book of the Law), Chapter 25 contains some interesting stipulations for caring for the land, and the people who were stewards of all that God had entrusted them with. And one of those stipulations was to observe a "fallow year" every seven years - in which there was to be no tilling, or planting, or harvesting, or reaping. It was to be a Sabbath to its Creator - a year of rest for the land, and its caretakers - in order that it might continue to produce a bountiful harvest for generations.

"And what about us?" they must have cried. "How will we feed our families, and care for our households?" "How will we survive?"

Moses' answer to them was the same as it is to us today - "God will provide."

And so God has. It has been nearly a year of living under the threat of Covid-19. It has been nearly a year of quarantining and isolation; of social distancing, and living with less than usual. And in that year, we have stepped up to provide out of our abundance the necessary food and clothing and basic necessities for those that lacked them. We have worked to encourage each other in ways that we had forgotten, and to make sure that those around us remained safe. We have taken the time to re-connect with our families, our loved ones, and our spouses - sharing quality time, and eating meals together. We have slowed down the pace of our living, and have taken time to rest and reflect on what is truly important in life.

A year of fallow. A year of rest. A year of depending more on God that we have been used to. A year of difficulties. A year of loss. A year of facing the unknown. But through it all, God has again proved His faithfulness. This past year was nothing like we could have ever imagined. But I trust that we will come out the other side stronger, and with a renewed faith and dependence on our God.

I was reminded of a quote from Gene Krantz, flight Director of Mission Control for the ill-faded Apollo 13 Mission, who said, "Some believe that this mission will be a blemish on our record. But I believe that it will prove to be our finest hour."

No matter what season we find ourselves in - whether it be a season of seedtime and harvest, a season of feasting, or a season of fallow - I trust that God is working ALL things together for our good - even when we cannot see it, or recognize it.

No matter how long it takes, we WILL return safely to our church building, and we WILL resume worshipping together, and we WILL carry on the mission and ministry that so many have come to love, to appreciate, and to depend on because we ARE a part of the church of Jesus Christ, and the gates of Hell will never overcome it.

May this prove to our finest hour, indeed!
