While this may cause some challenges for some, we believe that in the long run, it will provide Grace UMC the best opportunity to become the church that God is calling us to be - a church on a mission to engage our community for Jesus.

Also within the pages of this newsletter, you will find reflections from some of the members of the Ad Council, in hopes of helping you to understand the dynamics that we have struggled with over these past number of months, as well as news of upcoming events and accomplishments in the life of Grace UMC. It is a very difficult task as a board to try to foster a sense of unity within our church and somehow get people involved in helping in the vision to grow our church. In hindsight, I'm not sure we accomplished that goal.

I am the recording secretary for our church's Admin Council. I had always wondered the purpose of the council. Just what does it do? Perhaps you have wondered, as well? The Council is the primary decision maker of the business side of our church, including looking after the well-being of our congregates.

Some Final Thoughts

A church is no different than any group of people - be it a workplace, social setting, or sports team. We all have different personalities; sometimes they mesh and sometimes they don't. It is human nature to think that our ideas or solutions to any situation are the best. We become frustrated when others don't see things as we see them. How many times do we see the speck in our brother's eye and miss the plank in our own? More than ever, I believe it became evident this past year.

In the spring of 2020, as Covid restrictions were in full swing, I really believed that this awful virus was going to be unifying as we all struggled with isolation and loneliness. But combined with a climate of unrest across the nation, I think in many ways it has become just the opposite. I found myself reading and hearing things I never thought people would say. We have become so passionate about what is going on around us that it has, in many ways, created a challenge for the administrative council.

The ad council is the governing body of the church. Committee heads, appointed members and the pastor come together to discuss the concerns of the church. As a group we then vote on how to move forward with the issues at hand. Covid brought about some deep and intense discussions as well as some difficult votes. In the beginning it was issues such as do we open or do we close, and if we open, when is best and how do we keep people safe? How do we continue to gather tithes so we can pay the bills? What ministries should we continue? What would seem like a simple decision became complicated when you had people who viewed the answers to these questions from different directions.

Once the church opened, the questions became a little more difficult. How do we justify two services when we only have twenty people attending? What do we do about the children and a program for them? Every discussion we held and every vote we took focused on the possible effect it would have on our congregation.

Now that people are getting vaccinated and feeling more comfortable about getting out, our Ad Council finds itself working to get the church back to as "normal" as possible. But even "normal" has its challenges. We have lost families and individuals to other churches, as we remained closed while others stayed open. How do we move forward? How do we make sure that, first and foremost, our current members remain a priority - but not lose sight of the need to rebuild in the years to come? The answers are no easier now than they were a year ago. I encourage you to seek out someone on the ad council and have a conversation with them if you have thoughts and ideas about how to best move forward. We need your input in order to move on in a way that is best for the church. We need everyone to help us do that. We are, as a committee, made up of individuals with different beliefs. I know that I have had times when I struggled with separating my opinions about what is best for the church with what truly IS the best for the church. Decisions were made with which I didn't agree and I struggled to understand why people thought the way they did. But when I take the time to still my mind, focus not on my selfish desires, but on the church - OUR church and the people I have come to call family - I know that using my voice to do what is collectively best for all of us is what God is asking me to do. I believe he is calling on all of us to become united in Him. When we do, everything will fall into place.
