But until that day comes, may we do our best to walk with Jesus, and to be counted among His disciples.

Easter Reflections

from the Pastor's Desk

In my dining room, perched on a shelf on the baker's rack that resides there, sits a half-full (or half-empty, if you so choose) bag of Jelly Belly Beans.



The beans that reside within its' sealed pouch are filled with juicy goodness in just about any flavor imaginable to man - from green apple, to juicy pear, to sizzling cinnamon. They hold the promise a delectable, mouth-watering experience in each bean. By combining a number of beans at once, you can experience the taste of a fresh-out-of-the-oven blueberry muffin, a cherry turnover, or lemon méringue pie - at least, that's what the bag promises. They are the surviving remnants of a Christmas Celebration weekend - only because my youngest daughter saw fit to seek to limit the amount her children could consume.

I will tell you that normally, those remaining little treasures would have migrated into my office, and gleefully been consumed over the next number of days. But this past year has brought about a lot of changes in my life, and I have chosen to leave the small, clear glass jar that sits prominently on my desk, empty.

It serves as a simple reminder that I have the power to make choices. I have the power to choose how much sugar I put in a body that no longer has the ability to process sugar in a way that is beneficial to me. I have the power to choose the things I will fill my life with - things that serve my own wants and my desires - or things that will further God's kingdom desires. I have the power to choose to be an encourager of people, or just another voice in the crowd - happy to condemn, attack, and discourage.

Easter is a reminder for us that people can be ugly. Sometimes, even those you thought were your friends can turn on you, and toss you to the wolves. Jesus experienced the terrible betrayal of his companion, and his friend, Judas Iscariot. And even though he knew it was coming - I am sure that the sting wasn't any less painful.

Maybe you've experienced that in your own life, and know first-hand what that feels like. It's a pain that you don't soon, if ever, forget..

But Easter is also a reminder that good **always** overcomes evil - that love **always** triumphs over hate. **ALWAYS**.

You have a choice. No matter how good, or how difficult life is for you right now - you have a choice. And those choices have lasting impact. One simple choice can change your life forever.

Jesus made the choice to endure the terrible suffering of the cross - that you might have a chance at a better life. He chose the nails, so that you might be able to choose life over death.
